## Kabadi

Description: Kabadi is a traditional Indian contact sport that involves two teams. One team sends a player to the opposing team's side to tag opponents and return to their half while holding their breath. The opposing team attempts to stop the raider. The game is fast-paced and highly strategic.

Tools: no physical tools are used, as the game relies purely on human strength and agility.

Cultural significance: Kabadi is a rural game, often played during festivals or community gatherings. It requires strength, speed and strategic thinking and is popular across South Asia.

Folk games and game tools are inseparable part of the ancient traditions and culture of the Uzbek people. Many folk games and their tools have passed down through generations and are still played today.

The tools used in folk games are typically made from simple materials and come in various shapes and sizes depending on the game's content.

# 1. Rope

Rope is used in many folk games, such as the "tug of war" game. The strength and length of the rope allow players to engage in a competitive tugging match.

## 2. Wooden sticks

Some of folk games, especially combat or sport games, involve wooden sticks. For example, in the Dandia game or in certain phsical battles, sticks are used.

### 3. Balls

Many folk games involve balls. The goal is often to throw, catch or pass the ball to defeat the opponent. Examples include soccer and basketball, which are similar to folk games in some cultures.
