TEACHING FOREIGN LANGUAGES TO HIGHER GRADES IN GENERAL EDUCATION BASED ON INTERACTIVE METHOD

Abstract: This article discusses the advantages and effectiveness of using interactive methods and teaching materials in teaching various foreign languages. - Exercises also require that language-based exercises should be exercises that require repeated repetition of language material;
- The selection of grammatical patterns and vocabulary should depend on the results of comparing the foreign language with the native language.
 - Great attention is paid to pronunciation.

The main disadvantage of this method is the abundance of mechanical exercises and the lack of real speech exercises.

Currently, foreign languages are taught in schools, colleges, lyceums, and higher educational institutions. In modern times, innovations are increasing in every field. In teaching a foreign language, step-by-step teaching based on the learner's potential and level of age gives good results. In this case, students are divided into groups based on 1. teaching at the elementary level, 2. teaching at the intermediate level, 3. teaching at the advanced level. For each level, a special active program is developed by the teacher. Active methods of education not only help to encourage students to think actively and engage in practical activities during the learning process, but also help to form a positive learning motivation, reveal and develop creative abilities, and help to master the educational material with high efficiency. For each stage of the lesson, it is necessary to use active methods that are effective not only for the teacher, but also for the students. I advise you to familiarize yourself with some

of them, I would like to emphasize that almost all techniques are mobile and can be used not only in foreign language lessons, but also in other subjects. 1. Organizational stage. "Carousel" ("Merry Go Round") This technique allows you to use imaginative thinking, memory. The first student takes a card from the teacher and names the associations with this word. The card is passed along the chain until it returns to the teacher. Each student has the opportunity to express his thoughts at a rapid pace. At this stage, students "remember" the material passed. To develop speaking skills, the principle of "Intellectual Warm-up" can be used during the lesson. As a rule, the lexical bases of such exercises are located on the board, especially at the initial stage. The growth of the "snowball" can proceed in two directions: with an increase in vocabulary and / or with an increase in the complexity of grammar. (EXAMPLE: I like to read books I like to read e-books. I like to read e-books because they are easy to use.) Working with signal cards This is a presentation of the previous material in the form of cards. This technique helps to structure the material and retain the attention of students.

Conclusion: In conclusion, as a result of using innovative methods in the process of teaching a foreign language, students' speech becomes more fluent, their mental and logical thinking skills develop, and they develop the skills of correct and quick responses. Such interactive methods not only increase the desire of students and young people to learn, but also motivate them psychologically. As a result, students begin to prepare thoroughly for the lesson process and improve the quality of education.
