By the late 15th century, English entered the Early Modern English period, marked by changes in pronunciation (known as the Great Vowel Shift) and the influence of the Renaissance, which added many words from Latin and Greek. Finally, Modern English emerged in the 18th century and continues to evolve today, shaped by global communication, technology, and cultural exchange.

Immersion, active listening, vocabulary practice

Highly effective method in language learning is immersion, a process in which learners are surrounded by the target language and required to use it actively in real-life contexts. As Scrivener (2010) explains, immersion fosters natural acquisition by forcing learners to interpret, respond, and think in the new language without relying on translation or native-language support. He notes: "Immersion creates the pressure and necessity to communicate meaningfully, which pushes learners beyond memorization into real understanding".

Listening is no longer viewed as a passive reception of sound, but rather as an active, dynamic process involving multiple levels of interpretation. Brown (2007) asserts that successful listening requires learners to construct meaning by integrating what they hear with their prior knowledge, context, and linguistic competence.

Moreover, Brown(2007) encourages teachers to provide contextualized vocabulary learning, such as semantic mapping, collocation exercises, and interactive speaking tasks, which allow learners to encounter and use words in varied, meaningful ways. And also, Brown ties vocabulary growth to cognitive theories of learning, highlighting how attention, noticing, and personal relevance enhance retention (pp. 403–410).

Using modern technology in learning English

Modern technology has significantly transformed the way English is learned and taught, making the process more effective, engaging, and accessible. With the rapid development of digital tools and platforms, learners now have the opportunity to practice and improve their language skills at any time and from any location.
