2. Compounding

Compounding involves combining two or more lexical units.

Examples:

blackboard

smartphone

cybersecurity

brunch (breakfast + lunch)

Compounding is especially productive in technological and media vocabulary.

3. Conversion

Conversion (zero derivation) is the change of a word’s grammatical category without modifying its form.

Examples:

to email

to text

to google

Conversion is common in digital communication, showing English morphological flexibility.

4. Abbreviation

Abbreviation includes shortening words or phrases.

Examples:

UN

NASA

app (application)

blog (web log)

Abbreviations demonstrate linguistic economy, especially in online contexts.

5. Derivation

Derivation forms new words by adding derivational morphemes.

Examples:

nation → national → nationality

create → creative → creativity

Derivation contributes significantly to vocabulary expansion.

Discussion

The analysis confirms that affixation and compounding are the most productive word formation processes in contemporary English. Conversion is frequent in informal and digital contexts, while abbreviation reflects globalization and technological development.

The collected examples demonstrate that word formation reflects social and technological changes. New realities generate new lexical items, and English adapts through flexible morphological mechanisms.

Conclusion
