According to Zoltán Dörnyei, the use of modern technologies in language learning significantly enhances students' motivation. When learners are highly motivated, they tend to engage more actively in the learning process, which in turn accelerates their acquisition of grammatical structures [4]. And also, Ishankuliyeva O. M. emphasizes that innovative techniques for teaching grammar, such as gamification, flipped learning, and contextual instruction, significantly enhance both the effectiveness and engagement of the learning process. According to the researcher, the integration of communicative, task-based, and technology-driven approaches enables educators to develop students' grammatical competence while simultaneously maintaining their motivation and fluency. Furthermore, she highlights the importance of future research in examining the long-term impact of these innovative methods on overall language proficiency [5].
