#### Grammar Rules of Articles

##### 1. Indefinite Articles (A, An)

Used when referring to one non-specific object or person.

A before consonant sounds, an before vowel sounds.

Examples:

I saw a cat in the garden.

She is an engineer.

Rule: The choice between a and an depends on the sound, not just the letter.

An hour (silent “h”)

A university (pronounced “yu”)

2. Definite Article (The)

Used to refer to a specific object, person, or concept already known to the listener/reader.

Examples:

I saw the movie you recommended.

The sun rises in the east.

3. No Article

Some nouns do not require an article, especially uncountable nouns or plural nouns used in general statements.

Examples:

Water is essential for life.

Dogs are friendly animals.

Rules and Common Usage

1. Introducing something for the first time

Use a/an:

I bought a book yesterday.

2. Referring to something specific already mentioned

I bought a book yesterday. The book is very interesting.

3. Superlatives and unique objects

Always use the:

The best student in the class.

The moon is bright tonight.

4. With certain expressions and institutions

Use or omit articles depending on context:

At school, in hospital, go to the gym, on the radio.

5. Geographical names

Rivers, seas, mountain ranges: the Nile, the Pacific, the Alps

Most countries do not take an article: France, Japan

Exceptions: the United States, the Netherlands

Common Mistakes

1. Using a/an with plural nouns:

Incorrect: I saw a cats. → Correct: I saw cats.

2. Omitting the for specific nouns:

Incorrect: I liked movie you suggested. → Correct: I liked the movie you suggested.

3. Confusion with uncountable nouns:

Incorrect: I drank a water. → Correct: I drank water.
