In conclusion, legal vocabulary in detective narratives performs complex stylistic functions that extend far beyond technical description.

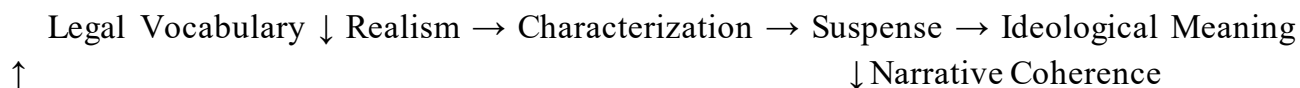
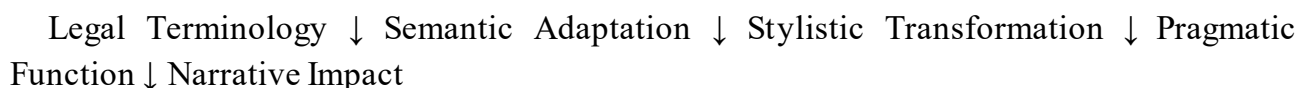
